My personal view is that the new venue was a success. It was more expensive than Lady Northcote and we made a small loss on the week but it was all well worth it. The facilities and the food were very good.


Many thanks to the teachers, the organisers and to everyone who was there.

é nach bhfuil ach trí foilsiúcháin aici, is mór an cáil atá bainte amach ag Claire Keegan mar scríbhneoir den chéad scoth.

Bhuaigh a céad chunasach, *Antarctica* (1998), an duais is luachmhar do scribhneoirí faoi daichead mbliana d'aois in Éirinn, s'é sin *Rooney Prize for Irish Literature*, a bhí bronnaithe ar Frank McGuinness, Anne Enright agus Hugo Hamilton idir alán eile le linn na triocha blianta anuas.

D'fhoilseadh an dara leabhar *Walk the Blue Fields* beag nach deich mbliana níos deanaí, i 2007, agus na criticí naisiúnta agus idir-náisiúnta go léir ag mol an chnuasach nua.

B'é san New York Times a fhoilsíodh 'Foster' ar dtús, i leagan gearrscéalta agus rinne an t-úrscéaltóir Meiriceánach Richard Ford cur síos ar an 'imposing array of formal beauties at the service of a deep and profound talent' nuair a bhronnadh an Davy Byrne Irish Writing Prize di i 2009.

San lá atá againn is annamh an rud

é 'novella' a fháil mar fhoilsiúcháin agus níl ach 88 leathanaigh ann san leabhar caol, éadrom sin foilsithe ag Faber anuraidh. Scéal a mbaineann le cailín óg agus an tslí ina thuigeann sí an saol agus na daoine ina mórthimpeallacht.

Tosnaíonn an leabhar leis an gcailín sa ghluaisteán lena hathair tar éis Aifreann, agus gan fhios aici cá bhfuileadar ag dul. Fágann a hathair le muintir Kinsella í ar feadh tamaill neamhchinnteach, feirmeóirí gan phaistí a bhfuil lán sásta grá agus cúram a thabairt don chailín. Is scéal cúramach é, trí shúile an chailín brónach, aonarach sin.

Tá atmaisféar dubhach ann ach is féidir bua an spiorád agus an saol a mhothú, d'ainneoin an t-uaigneas agus an ciúineas a iompaíonn gach éinne san áit iargúlta sin i lár na tíre. Is léir go bhfuil anáil John McGahern, William Trevor agus Marina Carr le bhraith anseo. Scríobhann siad go léir as lár-réigiún na hÉirinn, áit a spreagann scéalta dian dorcha l'atmaisféar fé leith atá ann san scéal seo freisin.

Scribhneoir fíor-tréitheach í Keegan, le stíl díreach agus dearcadh

daingean a léirítear saol agus meon an ghnáthduine. Gan dabt tá filíocht agus uilíochas insna scéalta a scríobhann sí, agus beidh lucht an litríocht go léir ag tnúth go mór leis an chéad scéal eile uaithi. Ag an am sin, caithfear a rá tá sárshaothar againn le 'Foster' ón scríobhneoir chumasach Claire Keegan.

Freagraí ag an mbun de leathnach

Dublin Coddle

This is a very popular dish, especially in Dublin, and has been so for many years. It is nourishing, tasty, economical and warming - what more could you ask? Although it is best made with a good stock - water in which a ham has been boiled, or even a ham bone - a light stock cube will substitute.

1lb/ 500g best sausages 8oz/ 250g streaky bacon 1/2pt/ 300ml/ 1 cup stock or water 6 medium potatoes 2 medium onions salt and pepper (serves four)



- 1. Cut the bacon into 1in/ 3cm squares.
- 2. Bring the stock to the boil in a medium saucepan which has a well-fitting lid, add the sausages and the bacon and simmer for about 5 minutes.
- 3. Remove the sausages and bacon and save the liquid. Cut each sausage into four or five pieces.
- 4. Peel the potatoes and cut into thick slices. Skin the onions and slice them.
- 5. Assemble a layer of potatoes in the saucepan, followed by a layer of onions and then half the sausages and bacon.
- 6. Repeat the process once more and then finish off with a layer of potatoes. Pour the reserved stock over and season lightly to taste. Cover and simmer gently for about an hour. Adjust the seasoning and serve piping hot.
