**T**á an Cumann tar éis bliain ghnóthach a chaitheamh i rith 2011/2012. Chuaigh mé féin agus Eamonn Ó Neachtain go dtí láinseáil Scoil na Locha 2012 i mí lúil chun obair an Chumainn a chur ós comhair na ndaoine. Lena linn sin thugamar bróisiúr amach. Sa mhí sin freisin, chuir an Cumann iarratas isteach chun Ambasáid na hÉireann ag lorg deontais chun rang na bpaistí a thosnú. Ar an drochuair níor éirigh linn.

Timpeall an am chéanna, bhíomar ag stracfhéachaint ar ionad nua a aimsiú i rith athchóiriú an Chlub Ceiltic agus iad ag obair ar foirgneamh nua. Bhí cruinniú ag na grúpaí cultúrtha eile a bhaineann úsáid as aíseanna sa Chlub chun dearbhú go mbheadh aíseanna oiriúnach againn san fhoirgneamh nua. Níor chúalamar aon rud arais fós. An t-eolas atá againn ag an am seo ná b'fhéidir go mbheadh an seanfhoirgneamh dúnta i 2013 agus b'fhéidir go nosclóidh ceann nua i 2016. Tá an Chlub ag fanacht fós ar cead ón Aire Pleanáile.

I mí Lúnasa, bhuaile mé le Ambasadóir na hAstráile go hÉireann, Bruce Davis nuair a bhí sé i Melbourne ar feadh tamaill gearr. Seo é an fear a thug, i 2010, dhá fháiltí roimh ballra agus cairde an Chumainn. Ar an gcéad uair bhíomar i Halla na Cathrach, Béal Feirste ag glachadh an chéad duais sa chomórtas Global Gaeilge. Ar an dára ocáid chuir sé fáilte roimh an grúpa, a chuaigh go dtí an Ghaeltacht i nGleann Cholm Cille, ina theach féin. Tá suim mhór ag Bruce sa Chumann agus bionn áthas anmhór air bualadh le ballra nuair a bhíonn siad i mBaile Átha Cliath.

Tháinig feabhas ar rudaí ag deireadh na bliana. Mar shampla, tháinig na grúpaí Ceiltic eile le chéile leis an gCumann agus bhí oíche an-áthasach leis na hÉireannaigh, na hAlbanaigh agus muintir na Breataine Bige ag déanamh craic le chéile! I ndhiaidh sin thosnaigh Daonscoil 2012 agus cé go raibh na huimhreacha níos lú ná blianta eile bhí sé an-rathúil. Muinteóiri nua a bhí ann ná Megan Raggett ó Tiobraid Árann agus Astráligh, Felix agus Christine Meaghan, ón Bushwahzee. Thóg Felix agus Christine an rang damhsa agus an chéilí ar oíche De hAoine.

Rudaí dearfacha eile a thárla ná; fuair an Cumann an triú duais sa chomórtas Global Gaeilge; bhí pobal againn i nGairdíní Edinburgh i gcomhair Lá Fhéile Pádraig; bhí ceathrar ón gCumann páirteach sa dhráma "Big Maggie" - Siún, Eamonn, Gerry agus Deirdre. Le déanaí bhí Trá na gCeist againn a bhi go hiontach agus ar a raibh beagán brabús!

Curtha le chéile, thárla a lán rudaí agus ba mhaith liom buíochas móra a thabhairt don choiste agus lucht chúnta a chaith isteach a lán ama chun gach ocáid a eagrú i gceart.

**T**he Cumann has had a busy year for 2011/2012. Myself and Eamon Naughton went to the launch of the Lake School for 2012 in July to showcase the work of the Cumann and distribute brochures on Daonscoil 2012. In the same month the Cumann applied for funding from the Embassy to start a children's class. Unfortunately, it was unsuccessful on that occasion.

Around the same time we were checking out suitable premises to relocate to if the club closed for renovations. The other cultural groups who use the facilities at the club held a meeting to discuss what would be available to us all in the new building. Feedback was given to the CC committee but we have heard nothing yet. The information available a few weeks ago was that the club may close in Dec 2013 and may reopen in Dec 2016. It is awaiting written permission from the Planning Minister.

In August, I met with the Australian Ambassador to Ireland, Bruce Davis. He's the man who, in 2010, gave two receptions to members and friends of the Cumann. The first time was at Belfast City Hall when members of the Cumann were accepting first prize in the Global Gaeilge competition. The second occasion was when he welcomed the group who attended the Gaeltacht in Glen Cholm Cille at his home. He is very interested in the Cumann and always enjoys meeting members who might be visiting Dublin.

The end of the year was more positive than the months previous. On our last night for 2011 the Celtic groups got together and the Irish, Welsh and Scots had great craic! Daonscoil 2012 followed and even though numbers were less than previous years it was very successful. We had a new teacher, Megan Raggett, from Tipperary and Australians, Felix and Christine Meaghan from Bushwahzee. Felix and Christine ran dance lessons and the ceili on the Friday night.

Other successes happened with us winning 3rd prize in the Global Gaeilge competition, we had a stall at the Edinburgh Gardens festival for St. Patrick's day. Four members of the Cumann taking part in the drama "Big Maggie" (Siún, Eamon, Gerry, Deirdre) and, lately, the Quiz Night which was brilliant and made a small profit!

Put all together, a lot happened and I would like to thank the committee and volunteers who put in a lot of hours to make sure everything worked well.

The first class of term four is on Tues 16<sup>th</sup> October. You can also check the start and finish dates of all the school terms for 2012 on our website.






## Eachtraí sa Tír Kath and Kim

**D**oes your smartphone do Irish? Is Gaeilge an option on the list of available languages? If this is something you have been eagerly waiting for then wait no longer. Just jump in the car and make your way to Fountain Gate shopping centre. The place has recently undergone a huge expansion and phase two is slated for September. But you don't have to wait that long, the shop you need is already there, it's called Vodafone and it's right there at the bottom of the escalator.



Just go in and ask for Olivia and she will demonstrate the Samsung Galaxy W for you. If you forget the model name think of W for Waterford. Once you select Gaeilge as your preferred language (*see photo on the left*) then all the shortcuts and prompts are displayed in Irish. And in a further display of just how the luck of the Irish continues to grow, the phone is available on a \$29 plan which is about as cheap as you can get. Your plan even includes international calls.



It's an Android phone which means you have access to all the Android apps including Collins Irish Dictionary.



Our correspondents also report that both Vodafone and Samsung have been very supportive of the Irish Language over the past few years since we first reported on SMS as Gaeilge back in issue 27 (*which is still available on our website - ed.*)

You can get predictive text to help with your Irish language SMS and various games and teaching aids from the Android app store
