First time at Daonscoil

This year we attended Daonscoil for the very first time, with great expectations of improving our language skills, and by the end of the week we really felt a sense of achievement in this. Importantly, we also had a very enjoyable time - we learnt and practised our lessons, we sang and danced and recited, we walked in the lovely bushland environment of Werribee Gorge, and shared many laughs with our fellow scoláirí. And we certainly did not starve.

Our beginners classes were taken by two enthusiastic and helpful teachers, Caitlín from Sydney, and Rúan from the Cumann in Melbourne. Although we were not rank beginners, having had lessons during 2014 with Daithí, we learnt new things and we consolidated a lot of our previous knowledge. We were lucky to be in a small group of 8-10 students, which contributed to our progress and enjoyment.

After classes, films were shown about Ireland and the guest speakers were interesting and informative for our cultural knowledge. Participation in electives also had us singing and reciting poetry in Gaelic, and even dancing in Irish. All this learning and experience had its culmination in the final concert, when we performed what we had learnt, and where we enjoyed the presentations of other classes.

The atmosphere created by the organisers and the more advanced students was very welcoming and inclusive. It was a pleasure to meet like-minded people from other parts of Australia. It was also good to get to know better other more advanced participants from our own Cumann, whom we had sometimes only known by sight or through brief greetings, throughout the busy year of Tuesday evening lessons. Finally, we loved the nightly sing-alongs, with many sharing their memories of favourite Irish songs.

Members receive a quarterly newsletter; access to the library; and also enjoy weekly singing and informal conversation sessions; as well as participation in social events and residential language schools.
